Free training to pursue opportunities in **REMOTE WORK**

An estimated 30% of people will be working remote and hybrid long term. Remote Work for ME provides Mainers the skills necessary to thrive as a remote or hybrid worker, and Maine businesses with the tools to manage dispersed teams effectively.

The Harold Alfond Center for the Advancement of Maine's Workforce is providing remote work training to 700 Mainers through 2024.

Occupational training prepares rural Mainers for remote jobs such as IT, medical coding and administration and customer service.

Remote Work Essentials for Professionals is a 10-hour self-paced program for experienced professionals and those new to a professional environment to gain the skills to be effective, productive, and healthy remote employees.

Leading Remote and Hybrid Teams is comprised of 15 hours of self-paced programming and 6 hours of class time and incorporates elements of the Remote Work Essentials for Professionals course with additional emphasis and modules for leaders. It provides supervisors with the tools to establish strong remote and hybrid practices and lead a dispersed team.
